THE POST-ROE CLIENT

Selina* took a home pregnancy test, saw those two lines and panicked. She searched on the internet for "abortion" and clicked on an advertisement paid for by CARE offering free pregnancy confirmation. When Selina came in for her appointment, she had already decided that she was going to have an abortion. As she explained her situation, she cried and even raised her voice. "I put myself in this situation," she said. "I don't know how to get out of it!" As we talked more about her circumstances, she was adamant about aborting and said her partner supported her decision. I explained that it is illegal to abort in the state of Louisiana and asked Selina's permission to explain the abortion procedure and risks. We discussed adoption. We also talked about what parenting this baby would entail. The nurse came in to talk about an ultrasound and Selina agreed to make the appointment. She also said that she may go out-of-state to terminate and not return to the center. Several days later, the client came back for her ultrasound and she told our nurse that she and her boyfriend had decided to carry and parent this child! Since Roe v. Wade was overturned, many people have asked if we will stay open and we answer, "Yes, because we are still seeing women that are considering abortion and in need of compassion, hope and help." We are still busy helping the women who walk through our doors.

Sarah was a college student who came to the pregnancy center alone seeking information on her options. She was undecided on her plans and had not told anyone else about her positive pregnancy test. She listened closely as the client advocate went through the options of abortion, adoption, and parenting. The client advocate also told her about Care Parenting Center. She shared with her about the support and resources available there. Sarah visited the parenting center that day and met the staff. Afterwards, she said she was feeling more like she could parent. When she came for her ultrasound appointment, the nurse asked her if she had made any decision regarding her pregnancy. She hesitated and said she was still not sure. When Sarah saw her baby on the ultrasound monitor, a smile came across her face. She was amazed that she was able to see her baby and its beating heart! She told the nurse that she decided she was going to carry and parent! Sarah said she really appreciated everyone's being so kind and helpful.
